Welcome to the Mid Term update!

As we reach the midpoint of Term 3, I want to take this opportunity to thank our students, staff, and families for their continued commitment to our school community. It has been a busy and rewarding term, marked by significant achievements, exciting opportunities, and important transitions.

One of the most important aspects of this time of year is the transition process. In particular, our Year 9 students are preparing to move from the Niddrie and East Keilor campuses to the Essendon Campus for Year 10 in 2026. This is a significant moment in their learning journey, and we are working closely with families to ensure students feel well supported and excited about the opportunities that await them in the senior years. Transition days, subject selections, and conversations with staff are all designed to make the process smooth and meaningful, setting our students up for success.

At Essendon, we are fortunate to have an environment that supports learning and growth. This term has also seen a wonderful celebration of the arts with our school production of Matilda the Musical. The show was a resounding success, showcasing the talent, dedication, and teamwork of our students. Remarkably, half of the cast came from our Middle Years (Years 7 to 9), which is an outstanding achievement and a sign of the sense of confidence we want our students to have in their areas of passion. Congratulations to every student who took part, and to Polly Maudlin and Lauren Steel, whose leadership and effort helped bring the production to life.







For our Year 12 students, this is a critical period as they continue to focus on completing their VCE and VCE-VM studies. We are immensely proud of the way they are applying themselves, taking steps towards their goals, and showing resilience as they prepare for their final assessments and pathways beyond school.

As always, we maintain high expectations for all our students, and the middle of the term is a good time to reflect on learning routines. Being well prepared for each day, engaged in class, and striving to meet challenges with a positive attitude are habits that lead to success. 



We are so proud of what we created together. Bring on next year's show—we can't wait!






YEAR 11 & 12 FORMAL BY MOHAMED ABDALLAH & MOHAMMAD ABDALLAH






