There was some good news regarding the "Quinn Grove Precinct Master Plan". If the plan is approved this would mean a significant improvement to sporting facilities in the area. For the school all of our sporting facilities, the oval, multipurpose courts and gym, would be upgraded. The school would have exclusive access until 5.00 pm weekdays and after hours there would be community access. The school would enter into a "Joint Use Agreement" with Moonee Valley City Council and work with them to manage the facilities. This would be a significant investment in the future of the campus.

Essendon Campus Update

Firstly, I'd like to thank the Essendon and broader EKC community for the support I've had stepping into the role of Acting Campus Principal for Term 2. Despite being a relatively short 9-week term, the senior campus has had a wide variety of learning and wellbeing opportunities for our students which will be showcased throughout the newsletter. We began the term with 2 goals: To maintain a safe and orderly environment & provide multiple opportunities for students to achieve academic success. Teaching and support staff worked with students week in and week out, whether it was in homework club. interschool sports, production rehearsals, lunchtime activities or in the classroom.

To support the students' academic success, we ran homework club twice a week with support from teaching staff, and at exam time, we broadened this

We incorporated study time into the weekly mentoring program and ensured we gave 'Positive Acknowledgements' on compass when students were demonstrating the positive behaviours set out in our SWPBS Matrix.

Senior students were fortunate enough to have many opportunities beyond the classroom with a wide variety of teams involved in the interschool sport program representing the campus and college against other schools. Our year 10 students had their first taste of senior school exams and selected students were part of excursions to the courts and our art therapy program. Our year 11 students enjoyed an excursion to RMIT & ACU as part of our careers program and finally got to spend quality time as a cohort together on their long-awaited camp. The Senior School formal was again a highlight of the year for the almost 250 students who attended.

VTAC and SEAS Applications for Year 12 students

It's not long until **Year 12 students** can start applying for courses for 2024 and beyond. From Monday July 31st (week 4 of Term 3), students will be able to create their VTAC accounts, apply for tertiary courses, apply for SEAS (special consideration), and also start undertaking scholarship applications. *Prior to this all students need to make sure they have created a USI (Unique Student Identifier).

Most students have a fairly clear idea of what they want to apply for but we encourage students to continue to search for their preferred courses via the VTAC Course Search website. Students should keep in mind the special entry schemes available to EKC students such as Latrobe Aspire and RMIT SNAP.

During Term 3, Mr Kingham will be responsible for assisting students with their VTAC applications. Any students wanting to apply for SEAS due to Disadvantaged Financial Background, Disability / Medical Condition or other Difficult Circumstances need to meet with Student Welfare Coordinator Ms Bianchin.

Year 10 into 11 Course Counselling

Year **10 students** have big decisions to make in Term 3 when they undertake their course counselling and select either mainstream VCE or the VCE Vocational Major.

Over the holidays, please read through the "EKC Guide to Selecting Subjects" so students can be prepared for this process which will kick off early in the term.

During Week 1 of Term 3 all of our Year 9 students will be undertaking their Careers Interviews which will break down the results of their testing from earlier this term. We look forward to hearing about the suggested career options and subject selections for our students. This will help students make more informed choices with their Year 10 subject selections.








Year 9 Languages in the Kitchen




Engagement & Wellbeing







Existing conditions

The Quinn Grove Precinct is located in the Keilor East neighbourhood, and currently provides a range of education, sport and recreation facilities and services - including the Keilor East Leisure Centre and Essendon Keilor College's East Keilor campus (EKC).

The Quinn Grove Precinct Plan aims to support the Keilor East neighbourhood by strengthening the community anchor at Keilor East Leisure Centre and Quinn Grove Reserve as a place where communities can gather for activities, events, recreation and to socialise.

Vision

The Quinn Grove Precinct is a welcoming and inclusive gathering place for health, well-being and lifelong learning, where people can be active and connect with their community. The precinct is a green, sustainable and accessible destination with a diverse and balanced mix of facilities and public spaces which are inviting for all.

The following five principles, along with their related key initiatives, are guiding the Master Plan's aspiration to achieve the vision for the Quinn Grove Precinct.

Integrated highball stadium & Keilor East Leisure Centre

A 6-Court Highball Stadium will become Moonee Valley's first major highball facility, and support growing demand for indoor sporting activities.

By integrating the new highball stadium with the existing Keilor East Leisure Centre, the building's footprint can be reduced through shared circulation space and loading areas, with minimal impact to the aquatic, gym and childcare functions of the existing Leisure Centre. The consolidated footprint allows for additional parkland and amenities in the precinct. This option also maximises solar access and minimises wind impacts for the outdoor swimming pool.

Relocated East Keilor Tennis Club pavilion & courts

New tennis courts and a pavilion will accommodate the East Keilor Tennis Club. The pavilion will be integrated with the Leisure Centre and highball expansion, allowing for access to amenities.

Relocated synthetic soccer pitch

Soccer clubs will retain access to a highquality synthetic soccer pitch in the precinct. During school hours, the facility is available for school use.

Synthetic school sports field

The sports field will feature a single-lined soccer pitch for after-hours use, positioned in a field that can accommodate AFL and other sports use during school hours.

Upgraded school sports hall & 1st Milleara scout hall

The school sports hall upgrade will improve the amenities and storage facilities for school use, as well as after-hours use by community groups such as the 1st Milleara Scout Group. The upgrades will include new change facilities to service the hall and sporting fields.

East-west shared path

This proposed east-west link improves pedestrian and cycling connectivity, legibility and accessibility throughout the precinct. It connects to existing paths through Keilor East to Valley Lake. The path is aligned adjacent to existing trees to create a pleasant, cool & shaded pathway, and is partially located on Council and school land.

North-south shared path

Widening the existing footpath to enable a shared path for pedestrians and cyclists, will create a safe link from the Quinn Grove Precinct to Steele Creek. This may require a minor realignment of the school's fencing to accommodate a suitable width.

Gathering spaces, plazas and social seating areas

Spaces for seating, gathering and hanging out. Some of these areas will act as plaza entrances to the highball stadium, creating an attractive public realm with a strong sense of place.

Playspace, parkland & ecology

Additional space for passive recreation. including a playground and barbeque area. A small wetland and biodiversity corridor improves local ecological connectivity along Rachelle Road.

Multi-sports courts

These courts will be upgraded as a multi-sports space for basketball, netball, futsal and tennis.

Car parking & drop-off locations

Car parking will be designed to accommodate easy drop-offs, and include electric vehicle charging. On-street parking will also be formalised along Rachelle Road. No parking encroaches school land.
